Susan Miles Gulbransen, Melodie Johnson-Howe and Fred Kline talked about their personal relationships with Sue and how she wrote her alphabet mystery series, which has a following around the world. After the panel, the participants boarded trolleys on a gorgeous sunny day to drive around town and stop at locations where Kinsey lived and worked, and even the sites of some murders that occur in her books. The tour was narrated by Irene Macias, former executive director of the library who wrote the script, as well as Anna Lafferty, Betsy

Green and Marsha Barr. While Irene wrote a script for a walking and trolley tour in 2004, she expanded it to include Grafton's later books.

In addition to the panel and tour, people were encouraged to fill out a trivia quiz to compete for prizes when they returned to the library. #### EARLY LITERACY KITS

Friends help support the library by funding programs and special collections like our **Early Literacy Kits**. These kits are "storytimes to go" with 5 books on a favorite theme, character, or developmental skill, plus a toy, costume, game, or other related accessory, plus a list of early literacy tips for caregivers with ideas for other learning activities that focus on the skills kids need to be successful in school.

#### **PROGRAMMING**

Friends donations support programming at the Library. For example, the Library is able to host guests at Music and Movement classes, from professional children's musicians to kids yoga instructors, to even the stars of Mo Willem's popular children's books, *Elephant* and *Piggie*.

## **EXPLORATION CLASSES**

The Library is also offering a **new early literacy class** this year that is supported by the Friends of the Library. Exploration Stations are opportunities for caregivers and children to engage in science, math, engineering, and literacy activities to help build the skills necessary to be ready for school. Each week there are 6-8 stations. Kids might learn about force and motion at the water table, arrange letters on the magnet board, practice fine motor skills with lacing, and explore color mixing at a light table. Each station is paired with recommended read-alouds and prompts for questions and interactions that caregivers can use to extend learning.
